# **UC Davis COSMOS – Residential Assistant**

**Employment Dates:** July 5 – August 5, 2023

• Training Week: evenings of July 5 – 7, full day July 8

Program Dates: July 9 – August 5 (see schedule for additional information)



**Program Description**: The UC Davis California State Summer School for Mathematics & Science (COSMOS) program is a month-long residential program for 200+ high achieving and motivated high school students. Students participate in one of the topic specific cluster areas taught by the UC Davis faculty. The academic and residential components of the COSMOS program offer these students a first glance at the college experience.

**Position Description**: Residential Assistants (RAs) work as part of the Residential Staff for COSMOS, primarily covering evenings and weekends. They are responsible for, but not limited to, supervision of high school students, attendance at all recreational outings, programming nightly activities, policy enforcement, conflict mediation, overall safety and security of students, and assistance with crisis management and emergency response. RAs generally work every night (except one weeknight) 5:00 pm – 9:00 am, and all-day Saturdays. RAs are required to remain at the dorms overnight during on-call nights to respond to any student emergencies that may arise. RAs partner with a Teaching Intern (TI) who are both assigned to one group of students (a cluster), for whom they will be the primary leaders. Both will also work for the program as a whole, supporting students from all clusters when needed. Space at the dorms is provided during shifts when the RAs must be present overnight.

While there is no academic component for this position, best efforts will be made to place RAs with their preferred cluster. Descriptions for all this year's clusters can be found <u>here</u>.

### **Position Qualifications:**

#### Required:

- UC Davis Undergraduate student registered at least through Summer 2023
- CPR and First Aid certified prior to the start of July training week
- Clear a criminal background check
- No vacation days during the employment dates
- Available during all on-call hours or on-call exceptions
- Commitment to stay at dorms during overnight shifts
- Able to complete the duties and responsibilities required of the position
- Flexibility to meet changing needs of the program

### Preferred:

- Experience managing youth groups
- Ability to assess needs and concerns of high school students
- Experience working in a multicultural environment
- Ability to lift up to 30 pounds

#### **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- Provide guidance and supervision to students ranging from ages 13-18
- Provide personal support to students
- Plan and lead nightly recreational activities
- Attend and supervise weekend outings
- Serve as a role model for appropriate conduct on a college campus
- Attend residential staff meetings
- Facilitate morning/nightly announcements with students
- Prepare and submit paperwork (such as incident reports, activity logs, etc.)
- Ensure safety and welfare of students by enforcing rules and addressing conduct issues
- Respond to emergencies as required
- Complete any additional duties assigned during the program in a timely manner

## Schedule:

The schedule below shows a typical work week during the program for RAs and TIs. The color of the block indicates who is responsible for responding to all student needs at that time. Staff must be on campus and able to respond immediately during the hours they're scheduled to work but may not be actively working during all those hours. Scheduled and required events or activities will be shared with the staff during the training week prior to the start of the program. Below are some expected exceptions to this schedule:

- All residential staff work the same hours during the training week and on Opening and Closing days
- If a field trip requires leaving or returning outside of scheduled hours, the staff member's hours will be shifted for that day (cluster specific schedules will be made available during training week)
  - Cluster 4: This cluster will have nighttime academic field trips that the TI is required to attend; later start times for the following day will be indicated in the cluster specific schedule
